

For many years, 'Partnership for Every Child' has been offering multifaceted assistance and support to such families, which enables them to cope with difficulties they face and keep the child in the family.

Family and childhood remain a top priority for our state and society. From 2018–2027 we mark the Decade of Childhood in Russia. And we shall definitely continue our work, hopefully with your support. We are very grateful to all of you for being with us and helping with our endeavours. Please stay on!

For over 25 years, we work to prevent socially driven 'de-facto' loss of parental care by children in St Petersburg and Russia as a whole. We aim to model best practice in child and family welfare support, provide a platform for development of advanced expertise and know-how, and facilitate strengthening of professional qualifications in the sphere of innovative social services. We work with partners in Russia and abroad to inform the professional community, exchange experiences and broaden the evidence base that proves the effectiveness of services and models applied.

99 families with children with disability received 26 120 hours of the 'Short Breaks Service'

109 children whose families face a difficult life situation remain with their parents

72 families were trained through the school of adoptive parents programme

74 specialists received training to strengthen their professional qualifications







'Short Breaks Service'

'Short Breaks Service' is a programme of assistance to families raising children with disability, developed in response to the needs of the parents. Within this programme temporary care for the child is provided by specially trained people known as a 'professional family' which makes it possible for parents of children in need of continuous round-the-clock attention to have some respite. This type of assistance helps to create a healthier environment in the family — parents receive timely support with childcare, they have an opportunity to deal with essential matters or just have some rest; and the child learns to socialise and communicate with new people. Thanks to this service stress levels in the family go down and the quality of life improves, and this makes it possible for the child to remain in the family. The frequency and locality of the service is determined by the family's requirements — it can be anything from a couple of hours to several continuous days, at the child's home, staying with a professional family or at an alternative recreational or rehabilitation facility. The ability to provide the service at the child's place of residence is essential as quite often children are not able to leave home due to their condition. 'Partnership' carries out selection and training of 'professional families', provides remuneration for their work, and co-ordinates and monitors the provision of the service.





Results of the 'Short Breaks Service':

99 families raising 109 children with disability received professional families' assistance with childcare

26 120 hours of the 'Short Breaks Service' were provided to families raising children with disability

32 new professional families were trained for participation in the 'Short Breaks Service' programme. 16 of them are actively involved in the programme

Active Family Support Service

'Active Family Support Service' has this name since 2018. Previously it was known as 'Crisis Intervention Service'. Within this programme, in cases where there is risk of loss of parental care, we offer families social, psychological and legal support, as well as material assistance, depending on their needs. We take on most complicated and challenging cases where it is essential not to judge and blame but to offer a hand in friendship and say: 'We shall manage this together, you are not alone, and your children will stay with you'.



The common view is that only social drop-outs, mothers who struggle with alcohol and drug dependencies, give up their babies. This is not true. Groups at risk include women with many children living in poverty; women who lost their partner during pregnancy; young mothers who lack confidence in their ability to bring up a child on their own. Domestic and welfare problems, loss of a job or housing, family conflicts, domestic violence — all these issues may lead to removal of the child from the family and thus to an increase in the number of 'de-facto' orphaned children with living parents.

But where there is no threat to the child's health and wellbeing, and the child is loved and cared for, our priority is to do everything possible to prevent loss of parental care. Together we explore root causes of the situation, develop an action plan and, with professional support from psychologists, lawyers and doctors, coach the family in how to find solutions to their problems. We also bring in trained professional families, which take on temporary care for the child if the parents are for some reason not able to provide appropriate care.



The Service's Results:

166 children received assistance

7 children were returned to their families from baby homes

102 children remained in their families

23 children were temporarily placed with professional families while we worked with families to help them resolve a crisis situation

Educational Activities

The organisation's educational activities in 2017-18 were delivered through the programmes of the Private Educational Institution for Supplementary Professional Education 'Institute of Child Policy and Applied Social Work' (established by the 'Partnership' in 2011)

74 specialists completed professional qualifications development training courses:

- Organisation of training for people wishing to become a guardian or a trustee of a minor, or to become foster parents of a child without parental care, in compliance with legislation regulating family matters in Russia
- Key aspects of work of a specialist of the guardianship and trusteeship bodies with respect to minors
- Professional therapeutic families for children from families facing a difficult life situation
- Organisational framework of early assistance

3 key objectives of the Institute:

1 training and strengthening of professional qualifications of the management and workforce engaged in social work with children and protection of their rights, as well as those working with foster and professional families

2 research, consulting, monitoring and evaluation of issues relevant to protection of children's rights

3 identification and documenting of promising practices in prevention of loss of parental care for children with living parents

The entire revenue from provision of educational services was directed towards development of the organisation and support of services offered to children and families.

35 professional families

Professional families received training for participation in the 'Short Breaks Service' and 'Active Family Support Service' programmes.

72 foster families

Families received training at foster-parenting schools for residents of St Petersburg and Leningrad Region wishing to adopt children without parental care.



International Activities

We are also a member of the regional alliance of Eastern and Central Europe and CIS countries — an informal affiliation of five NGOs: 'Partnership for Every Child' in Russia, Moldova (www.p4ec.md) and Ukraine (www.p4ec.org.ua), 'Partnership for Children in Georgia' и 'For our Children' Foundation in Bulgaria (www.detebg.org). 'Partnership' is an active contributor to the alliance's business unit, P4EC Consultancy Group, delivering consultancy and technical assistance to a range of contractors such as UNICEF, local and national authorities, state and non-state service providers, donors and international consulting firms working in the field of assistance to families with children. Engagement in these international bodies enables us to share expertise, learn about the most effective practices that help prevent loss of parental care for vulnerable children and safeguard the rights of children without parental care. It gives us an opportunity to initiate structural changes that help increase the number of children growing up in a safe and stable family environment.

'Partnership' is a member of the global alliance 'Family for Every Child', which brings together civil society organisations from 32 countries, united by a common vision of a world where every child can grow up in a safe and caring family.



In 2017–2018, 'Partnership' staff were actively involved in the following projects:



'Child-friendly social environment — development of alternative social services within the framework of transformation of the system of care for children'

institutional consultancy for preparation of the social service standards and curriculum for teaching social work professionals'

Turkmenistan, Sept 2017 — Oct 2018

'International

The project resulted in the development of a training programme for child protection specialists and the development of minimum standards and procedures for the provision of special social services for the child and the family.

Kazakhstan, Sept 2017 - June 2018.

The project provided support for the government initiative on the development and practical implementation by 2020 of inclusive (integrated) quality services for vulnerable children and families, including the development of standards of social services and the development of a training programme for future professional social workers.

'Every child has the right for a family. Support for deinstitutionalisation'

Tunisia, Oct 2017 - March 2018

Development of the National deinstitutionalisation strategy and the establishment of a specific action plan to enhance the strengths of the existing child protection system, develop a wide range of services to meet basic needs of children without family care or at risk of losing parental care, children born out of wedlock, children with disability and other children at risk of separation from their parents, and to strengthen prevention and family support mechanisms. Regional Conference on Social Service Workforce and Social Work

May 2018 — March 2019

P4EC Consultancy Group provided technical support to UNICEF in the organisation of a high-level regional conference on social services workforce held on 21-23 November 2018 in Bucharest, to document promising practices and models of social work/social services workforce roles and functions in the ECA region, construct a metric for measuring investment and progress in the social work/social services workforce for its enhancement, and to ensure quality participation by contributors.

It is essential for us that as many people as possible learn about our work and about ways of helping families and children facing difficulties in their lives. In 2018, with support of the Committee for Press and Media Engagement of St Petersburg we organised a social advertising campaign "Family - the Foundation of a Happy Childhood". Provision of comprehensive assistance to families with children in a difficult life situation, including families raising children with disability." Within the campaign framework in St Petersburg throughout September-October 2018 we placed 235 posters, 30 billboards, and 1000 stickers in the metro carriages; a visual clip was shown on media displays on buildings; a 30-second social advertising video was produced and broadcast on TV Channel St Petersburg.

The campaign had the following objectives:

- To highlight to the general public the importance of preservation of a family environment for all children
- To inform the public more comprehensively about programmes of assistance to families with children in a difficult life situation, with focus on children with disability
- To encourage more socially-aware pro-active attitudes among the residents of St Petersburg in order to increase levels of financial support of the programme from private donations
